1 Welcome and Registration

1.1 About Font Bundle

Welcome to Font Bundle, an enhancement for the Newton 2.1 OS that expands the power and versatility of the button bar. It controls the size of the button bar, can hold many more icons than before, launches applications from the button bar, and allows you to save multiple button bar configurations to be used as needed. Using Font Bundle, you can also shrink the bar into a small floating window that gives you the maximum amount of free screen space, or you can move the button bar to the top or sides of the screen.

Included in this archive are the following packages:

- Font Bundle.pkg

This is the software package that you need to install on your Newton

- Font Bundle.pdf

This is the users' manual for Font Bundle. You are reading it right now.


- Font Bundle.txt

This is a text only format of the users' manual. If at all possible, use the pdf version of the manual as it has layout and graphics that cannot be included in the text version. The pdf version of the manual is viewed using Adobe® Acrobat Reader®. This can be obtained free of charge at www.adobe.com.

- SASTuff.txt

A list of all of the software available from Stand Alone Inc.

- SA reg.pkg

If there isn't a registration option under the  button, install this package to register your software.

1.2 System Requirements

Font Bundle requires Newton OS 2.0 or 2.1, and a Message Pad 120, Message Pad 130, Message Pad 2000, or eMate.


1.3 Registering Font Bundle


The Font Bundle Demo will work for a 30 day trial period. At the end of the 30 Days, it will stop working. To avert this tragedy, you will need to get in touch with Stand Alone to register your software. You can register with us by several different methods.

You will need to include the following information, no matter how you choose to register. Most importantly, you need to include your name EXACTLY as it is entered in your Newton, including spaces. We use this to generate your password, so it must be precise. You will need to specify which programs you wish to register, and include payment for each of them. We accept Visa, Mastercard, and American Express. If you are using normal mail, you can send us a check as well. Make sure to include your card number, the expiration date, and what type of card you are using. You also need to give us a way to get in touch with you. Email is the preferred way, followed by your address and phone number. An Email address is not strictly necessary, but it will result in much faster service.

For instant gratification, register by phone, and pay using Visa or Mastercard. To do so, call (773) 477-2492 and we will give you a password right over the phone.

Alternatively, you can send us a check to the address below.

You can also Email us one of several ways. The application has a Register section under the  button. Tap on that to open up a registration slip. If you fill out that slip, and have an Email client on your Newton, it will automatically Email us and we will send you a registration code. You could also just Email us the relevant information from your Newton or a desktop machine, and we'll send you a code. If you are registering through Compuserve, use, GO SWREG.

Once you register, you will receive a password from us. You can install this password one of two ways. There is an option to Enter Password under the  menu. Tap on it to bring up a screen that has a space to enter the password. Alternatively, just install the SA Register package enclosed in the Font Bundle archive. Select "Font Bundle" from the pop-up menu at the top, and enter the password. You should get a message confirming the password. Afterwards, you may remove the SAS Register application from you Newton.

1.5 Reporting Bugs

If you find a bug in our software, it would be helpful if you reported the bug to us. To report a bug, please Email us with Bug Report Request in the subject line. In the Email, include the following information:

- What type of Newton you are using (i.e. MP 2000)
- The version number of the system software (i.e. Newton OS 2.1)
- The software name and version number (i.e. Font Bundle 1.03)
- The error number
- A brief description of how we can recreate the error
- Your name and Email address so we can contact you when the bug is fixed

When reporting bugs, it is best to Email us, rather than calling, so that the programmers have a written record of the information they need to solve the problem. As soon as we receive your Email, the programmer will examine the problem, and fix it.. Because our programmers are busy creating software, it can take a while for them to reply, but they will release a new version of the software that fixes the bug as soon as they can.

2 Installation

The first thing that you need to do to get your software up and running is to install it on your Newton. To do this, you need to have Newton Backup Utility, or Newton Connection Utilities, set up to talk to your Newton. If you have problems with this part of the installation, please contact consult the documentation that came with your Newton. Once Newton Backup Utility is set up, just follow the steps listed below to for each of the packages you wish to install.

1. Open the Newton Backup Utility , or Newton Connection Utilities



on your Desktop machine.

2. On your Newton, go to the Extras Drawer  and tap the Connection icon



3. Once the Newton Backup Utility has loaded on your desktop machine, make sure your cables are connected and tap the **Connect** button on your Newton.
4. For each of the packages you wish to install, do the following:

- Tap the Install Package button in the Newton Backup

Utility



- Go to the folder where your packages are, and select the desired package.
 - Click on the “Install” button
5. After you install fontpack.pkg or fontpack II.pkg, it is necessary to restart your Newton. When these are installed, it will be necessary to restart your Newton after freezing or unfreezing these packages. Also, if they are installed on a memory card, you will need to restart after inserting or removing the card.

3 Font Packs

1 and 2

The two Font Packs give you a host of new fonts for your Newton.

3.1 Special Installation Instructions

When installing the Font Package, please follow the procedure detailed in the front of the manual. In addition, it is necessary to restart your Newton when you install the Fonts package. Also, it is necessary to restart after freezing or unfreezing the Fonts package. If you installed the Fonts package on a memory card you will also need to restart after inserting or removing the card.

3.2 Accessing Fonts

The new fonts provided in the Fonts package can be accessed anywhere you can change fonts.. In either case, once the package is installed in your Newton's memory, it activates automatically, making the new fonts available.

3.3 Font Pack Vol. 1

Font Pack Vol. 1 adds an additional 12 fonts to your Newton, these fonts appear optimally in point sizes: 12 and 18 on non-postscripts printers.. When changing the font size, you will see a dot next to some of the sizes. These are the sizes that are recommended for that font and should be used for best results when printing to non post script printers. All of these fonts print to non-postscript printers, some print to both non-postscript and postscript (laser) printers, and some substitute similar fonts when printing to postscript printers.

3.3.1 Postscript Fonts

The following fonts print on both non-postscript and postscript printers:

3.4 Font Pack Vol. 2

Font Pack Vol. 2 adds an additional 6 fonts to your Newton, these fonts appear optimally in point sizes 9, 10, 14, 18 and 24. All of these fonts print to non-postscript and postscript printers.

The following fonts print on both non-postscript printers and postscript printers:

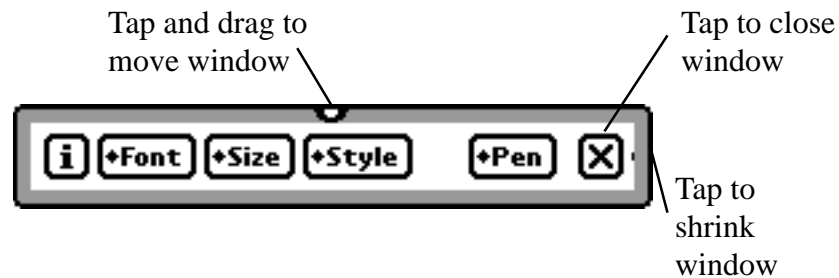

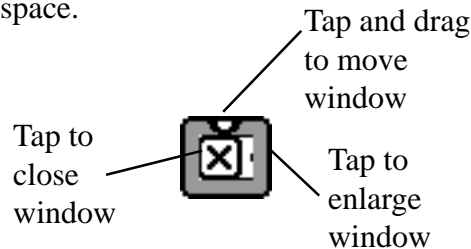
4 Styles Package

The second package included in the Font and Styles Pack is the Styles package. The Styles package gives you quick access to your new fonts in the NotePad.

When the Styles package is installed, a button **A:** will appear at the bottom of the NotePad. This button gives you access to a styles pallet. The styles pallet includes the **i** Menu, Font, Size, Style, and Pen.



Tap on any of the buttons to open their menus, or tap the close button to close the window. Tapping and dragging on the tab at the top of the window lets you reposition the window on the screen. If you tap on the right side of the window, it closes the pallet to save space.



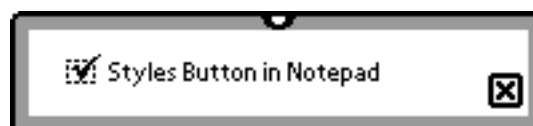
Tap on the right hand side of the small window to enlarge it, or on the close button to close it.

4.1 The **i** Menu

The **i** menu contains four options. About gives you some information on the program and also how to get in touch with the publishers.

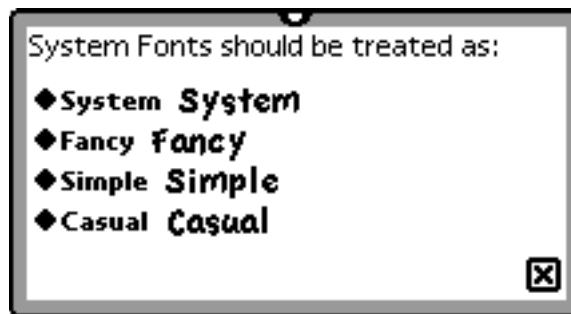
4.1.1 Prefs

This lets you decide weather or not to include the styles button in the NotePad.



4.1.2 Edit Fonts

Edit fonts lets you exchange a new font for a font built in to your Newton. Using this feature you can, for example, tell your Newton to use a font of your choice when ever it would normally use the System font.

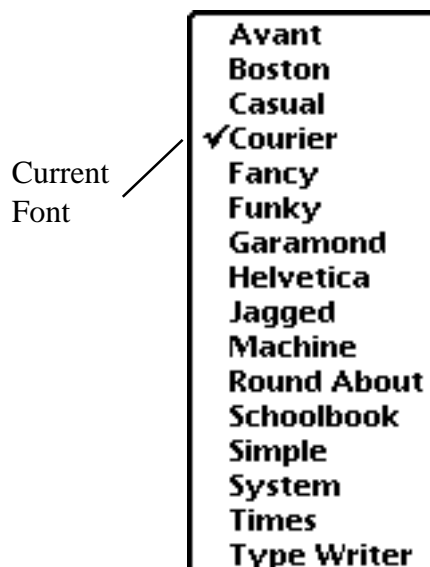


4.1.3 Register

This menu is only used to enter a code to unlock an expired copy of the Font and Styles Pack. If you purchased your copy of Font and Styles Pack you will never need this menu, as the software is not a demo version and will never expire.

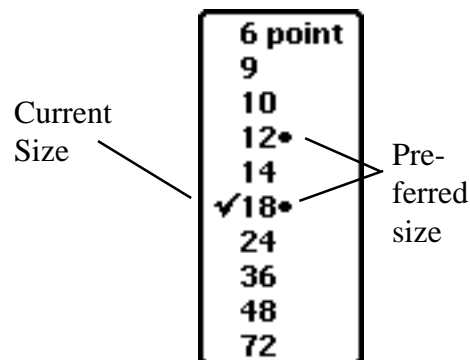
4.2 Font

This menu gives you a list of all the fonts available for use. To select a font, simply tap on the name of the font. A check mark will appear next to the font currently in use. In addition, if you have any text selected it will be converted into the new font.



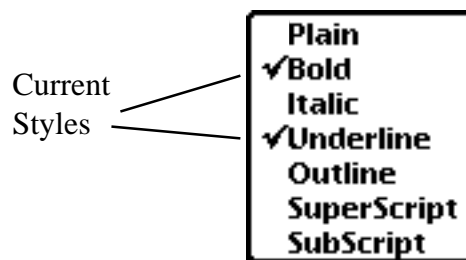
4.3 Size

The Size menu lets you set the size of the font you are using. To select a font size, tap on the size you wish to use. A check mark appears next to the size of the current font. If there is a dot to the right of a number, it is a preferred size that for that particular font when printing on a non-postscript printer.



4.4 Style

The font face can be changed through this menu. Tap on the face or faces you wish to use to select it. A check mark appears next to the selected face.



4.5 Pen

This menu lets you select the width of the pen. A check mark appears next to the pen width currently used. Tap on a pen width to select the one you wish to use.
